It's time to start thinking about Garden Tour Cookies! Remember no nuts and no chocolate. The following recipe belongs to Rita Williams (Kathy Williams' Mother-in-Law) and is perfect for tour cookies.

Butter Cookies

3 sticks of butter, softened at room temperature

1 ¼ cup of sugar

3 cups of flour

Pinch of salt

1 egg

1 teaspoon of vanilla

Cream the butter and sugar with an electric mixer. Gradually add flour and salt. Add egg and vanilla. Bake at 350 degrees about 7 minutes. Cookies are ready just before they turn brown around the edges. Suggestions and tips: This recipe works great with a cookie press. When cookies first come out of the oven they may appear to be "unfinished" (raw and moist). Just transfer them to a wire rack to cool and everything will turn out just fine.
