#### Ask a Gardener

I would like to have a small vegetable garden in my yard but do not have a lot of space or time to prepare the ground for planting. Any ideas on how I can grow my own vegetables?

Two ideas for simple vegetable gardens:

- Try planting in containers. You can use most any large pot and fill it with potting soil. Herbs and cherry tomatoes grow especially well in pots. Take a look at this <u>container gardening website</u> for ideas.
- 2. If you have a little more room try straw bale gardening. All you need is a straw bale, some nitrogen fertilizer and water to get started. It is a lot less work than a traditional garden. Weeds are not a problem. It does not matter about the quality of your soil. To learn more about straw bale gardening visit the website preparednessmama.
- 3. And, finally, perhaps the best gardening advice of all, a reminder from our devotional presented by Brenda Moore back in January (a partial reprint of the poem she read that day).
