Garden Tour Grants Awards

At the October General Meeting, the 2017 Azalea Garden Tour Grant awards were presented by Kimberly Exum. Grants totaling \$72,423.42 were awarded to 23 local non-profit groups and covered a wide range of projects including community gardens, bald cypress tree plantings, teaching gardens, landscape beautification, as well as continued support of our scholarships at UNCW and CFCC and to the budget of Audubon NC for the conservation and management of islands in the lower Cape Fear River that provide nesting sites for thousands of migrating water birds annually. The other groups receiving grants include Airlie Gardens Foundation, Alliance for Cape Fear Trees, Bellamy Mansion Museum, Brigade Boys and Girls Club, Cape Fear Community College Foundation, Cape Fear Habitat for Humanity, Dreams, Forest Hills Global Elementary, Lower Cape Fear Historical Society, Lower Cape Fear Hospice, NC Coastal Federation, NC Sorosis, New Hanover County Arboretum, New Hanover County Arboretum Ability Garden, New Hanover Regional Medical Center, New Horizons Elementary School, St. Mark's Episcopal Church, St. Mary School and the Basilica Shrine of St. Mary, The International School at Gregory, and Wrightsboro

Gifts from the Little Family

At our September meeting, our guest Robby Little gave us some items from his mother, Billie Sidbury Little, and his grandmother, Wille Sidbury.

One was an original copy of the Garden Club of North Carolina's incorporation papers dated August 1, 1940. The first signature was Willie Sidbury's followed by that of Edna Maslin, who was the first president of GCNC and for whom the Maslin award is named. Incidentally, CFGC became incorporated October 12, 1987.

Another gift was a Cape Fear Garden Club yearbook from 1950.

The cover was done by artist Claude Howell whose mother was a member.

Her address was Carolina Apartments where Claude was born in 1915 and lived until his death in 1997. (The family lived on Oleander Drive from 1929-36). The dues in 1950 were \$2.00 and meetings were held in the Great Hall of St. James Church, where the first meeting of CFGC was held on February 11, 1925. On page 16 is an In Remembrance page for Mrs. J. Buren Sidbury (Willie) who also served a president of GCNC. 1950 marked the 25th Anniversary of CFGC and the yearbook contains many milestones of our club's first twenty-five years.
