### **Presidents Message**

discovered an army of weeds that invaded our space when not looking. Needless to say, at the end of the day, our backs and hands hurt, but we're thankful to be healthy enough to get the job done and know that soon the summer flowers will abound!

### There is Garden Club business to discuss with you:

A vote will be emailed to you on our 2020/2021 Budget. This was to be presented at the March meeting, but due to the cancellation of that meeting, the April meeting, and most likely the May Luncheon we must communicate electronically.

Our Policies & Procedures state: *Upon Executive Committee approval the budget must be presented to the General Membership no later than the April General Meeting*.

Please be on the lookout for this email and please vote, your vote is important. FYI...The proposed budget that you will receive was revised and voted on by the Executive Committee last week, to reflect income from our general checking account fund to balance the budget. Normally the Azalea Garden Tour provides \$5,000 to our annual general budget funding, however due to loss of revenue from the tour we voted to take this from carry over funds from our general account. Originally when the Executive Committee voted and approved the budget on March 9, 2020, for your review at the March General Meeting (which was cancelled) we had -included the funds from the Garden Tour, however due to cancellation of the tour we thought a revision was in order.

Thank you for your patience on details, but this gives you the background as well as historical documentation on why we proceeded in this manner.

It is doubtful that we will have our May Luncheon with the installation of new officers, however the new officers will automatically move into their positions on

June 1, 2020. We plan to have a ceremonial event at the September General Meeting for them.

Due to the cancellation of the 2020 Azalea Garden Tour our Tour Chair, Sandy Cyphers was not able to see the fruition of her yearlong-plus work on the Tour, thus the below changes have been made with the approval of the Executive Committee.

- Sandy Cyphers will remain as Tour Chair for this coming year 2021.
- Chery Nabell will remain as the Vice Tour Chair for this coming year 2021.

Cheryl Nabell was scheduled and voted on to be the 2021 Garden Tour Chair, but resigned so that Sandy Cyphers could be appointed to that position, and Suzanne Edwards and Jamie Lanzi whom were scheduled to serve as the Garden Tour Co-Vice Chairs resigned so that Cheryl could move into the Vice Chair position. We can't thank them enough for making the changes possible and for the willingness to serve in such important and demanding positions.

Normally our Corresponding Secretary Lannie Kirby does not share details on why cards have been sent to our members, but I think you would want to know about our members who have been affected by COVID19. It seems that we will not go untouched and our prayers are important.

Meredith Lewis's husband Lance is recovering, Marlene Eader's daughter is recovering (she lives in Cary and has 5-year-old twins). Mary Katherine Turner's husband, Ron, has been in the hospital with the virus and is now home, however Mary Katherine now has the virus. Becky Varner's daughter is on the front line as an ER doctor helping patients in Toronto. Our daughter, Shannon, is a nurse in a Boston area hospital and working in ICU. Shannon tells us that the news cannot depict the impact on people who are being affected and the suffering.
