

Sculpture in the CFGC Urban Garden at Riverfront Park Submit Ideas for Centennial Sculpture in the CFGC Urban Garden at Riverfront Park: With the official motion for the Urban Garden of the Riverfront Park to be showcased as the Centennial Project, the plan is to seek a sculpture design to be placed in the CFGC Urban Garden. It is our hope that the installation of a beautiful sculpture which represents the spirit of our club will occur in 2025, during an official ceremony as a part of our Centennial Celebration.

We are actively seeking ideas for the sculpture and plan to compile them and bring them before the Executive Committee and entire club membership for final approval. The Centennial Committee has discussed several beginning options as subjects for a sculpture but wanted to give all members an opportunity to weigh in on this important decision. The discussion has circled around wildlife and garden themes, as well as using the figure of a gardener.

We have already contacted Dumay Gorham and he has expressed willingness to complete a commissioned piece by our club. Based on recommendations, we will develop sketches to be submitted to Dumay so he can better guide us as to price and size. We are hoping to make the sculpture at least 5-6 feet tall so that it is easily visible in the garden.

Write out your ideas and feel free to include sketches or pictures if possible. You can attach extra narratives or pictures.

Deadline: January General MeetingWildlife theme: indicate **specific** ideas and even pictures if possible: (example: Hummingbird drawing nectar from an azalea flower)

Garden Theme: indicate specific floral species (Jessamine, Dogwood, etc.)

Figure: Gardener, child, etc (be specific in the activity or pose you envision).
