Battery Island Cruise - May 15th

Join us as we cruise to the Lower Cape Fear River Islands to the nesting areas of Brown Pelicans, White Ibis, Royal Terns, Egrets, and American Oystercatchers on Sunday, May 15th. We will cruise on the Henrietta riverboat docked at the river walk in downtown Wilmington and travel to Battery Island across from Southport. Lindsay Addison, Coastal Biologist for Audubon NC has agreed to narrate the cruise this year. The Henrietta riverboat features an airconditioned lower level with tables and chairs and a canopy-covered upper deck with chairs. The riverboat is wheelchair accessible. The Henrietta holds 118 passengers and will depart at 1 PM and return to downtown at approximately 6:30 PM. Proof of COVID vaccine is required.

Arbor Day Celebration is Coming

Commissioner Rob Zapple and NHC Board of Education Vice- Chair Mrs. Stephanie Walker. Thank David Johnson of Johnson Nursery in Willard has graciously agreed to donate at least two of the trees! The kids at Trask are very excited and CFGC Associate

Member Matt Collogan will be spending the morning showing them how to plant trees (three trees will be donated by the Alliance for Cape Fear Trees). The tree plantings will culminate a week of activities by the Alliance celebrating N.C. Arbor Day, including a tree giveaway, FriendRaiser at Wrightsville Beach Brewery, and educational activities. Longleaf Pine Decline Saving Mature Trees, in particular, the Longleaf Pine Two big values, Stormwater management as well as wildlife habitat.

Last summer, I started to be aware of the decline of the Longleaf pine

throughout Wilmington, very noticeable with the tree canopy turning yellowish light green and limbs dying slowly. Other pines turned bright red and died very quickly.

In the early fall, I met with Bill Walker, NC Forest Service. We walked a neighborhood of pines. The decline is a result of many environmental factors. Trees become stressed from hurricanes, droughts, lightning, etc. Then opportunists, the IPS beetle, in particular, move into stressed pine trees. Not much can be done once a tree is infested with IPS. Management of tree removal There are so many pine trees currently in decline. Most observers of tree issues typically wait until warm weather to remove them. However, the best time to remove pine trees is during the winter season when the IPS beetle is dormant.** When the beetle is active, usually beginning in March and lasting through November, the resinous smell of pine trees being cut down attracts the beetle to other nearby pine trees. The IPS beetle is capable of producing up to 10 generations in a season.



** Tree removal companies may also give a discount during the winter season.** Note: Removal of only dead branches as well as leaving a tree stump can still attract the IPS beetle during their active season. Please help save the remaining healthy longleaf pines in Wilmington and surrounding areas.
