

Horticultural Minute Gardening Tips for Late August-September

If re-blooming Azaleas are not to their potential in your garden, it is time to feed them for the last time this season with an Azalea and Camellia formulation. Speaking of camellias, it is time to feed them for the final time as well.

Feed all of your containers, if applicable, with a Granular, Time-Release Fertilizer. Plants like Million Bells, Petunias, Basil, and Parsley require lots of Nitrogen, so using a Tree and Shrub formulation works best. Succulents, Vinca, and Tropical Hibiscus use lower amounts of Nitrogen, so a Bedding Plant Food works best.
