Ingredients:

2 1/4 c. Plus 2 T. all-purpose flour
1/2 t. Ground cloves
1 t. Ground ginger
1 t. Cinnamon
]2 t. Baking soda
1/2 t. Salt
3/4 c (1 1/2 sticks) unsalted butter
1 c. Sugar
1/4 c. Blackstrap molasses
1 large egg
3 1/2 oz (1/2 bag) The Ginger People
Crystallized Ginger Chips
1/2 c. coarse or raw sugar

Chewy Ginger Snap Cookies Heda Waldrep

We have had many meetings preparing for our fun night together at the Soiree, (and hope you are planning to attend!) At one of our meetings, Heda Waldrep brought the most delicious homemade ginger snap cookies to share. They were so good that I asked her to share her recipe with all of us. They are perfect for this time of year, so here it is and I hope you enjoy them!

Directions:

Preheat oven to 375. Sift dry ingredients together and set aside. In a large bowl, mix butter and sugar until light and creamy. Stir in molasses and egg. Add dry ingredients to wet ingredients. Mix well and then stir in the chips. For best results, chill dough for one hour. Form 1 1/2' balls and roll in coarse sugar. Place on parchment lined cookie sheet, 2' apart, and bake for 8-10 minutes until edges start to set.

Horticultural Minute Gardening Tips for October

What are your favorite fall herbs to plant?

Two favorites: 'Tuscan Sun' rosemary and Lemon Thyme- so fragrant and great to cook with. Both of these herbs will reward you throughout the fall/winter months if placed in a sunny location, watered, and fertilized, as needed.

Hydrangea tips: if you cut your hydrangeas in the fall, they will not bloom in the spring. Mophead, Lace Cap, and Oakleaf Hydrangeas all bloom off the top 1/3 or so of last year's blooms! Remove those stems and you remove the blooms! In January, you can thin out

1/3 of the oldest stems to open up the plant to provide better air circulation. The better time to reduce the size is to prune them right after the blooms fade, mid-summer.



To facilitate this, we will have a table set up at each General Meeting with literature on how easily this can be done and a sign-up sheet for those who need help with this process, especially since this application is done online.


Mark your calendars for a Workshop on Wednesday, May 17th at 1:30 pm at the Arboretum. This will also be a primer on how to have your Garden certified.
