Gardening for Wildlife

The Gardening for Wildlife Committee (GFW) has been busy doing and planning towards our goal of City-wide Community Certification for Wilmington! April had GFW teaming up with the Arbor Day Committee to plant trees at Eden Village. It rained, but we were able to plant the trees that we hope will be a home to wildlife as Eden Village is a home to the homeless.

As we continue planning many activities, our next one will be Earth Day at Long Leaf Park on Saturday, April 20th, from noon until 5 pm. We will be giving out hand-painted "ladybug" rocks (by Marion Kreh), and there will be displays featuring wildlife-friendly plants, bee baths, birdhouses, and literature on certifying your garden. We will share our table with the Lower Cape Fear Wildlife Chapter, so please come and support us!

Delores Hawes will be at our table (with her computer) at the April General Meeting to help you sign up your garden to be wildlife certified! You only need to identify the four basic areas of your garden that provide wildlife food, water, cover, places to raise young, and integrate sustainable garden practices (i.e., using rain barrels, removing invasive plants, and using native plants). 



Battery Island Bird Cruise Sunday, May 19th, 2024

Join us on Sunday, May 19th, for an educational boat cruise to the Cape Fear River Bird Islands, nesting sites of Brown Pelicans, White Ibis, Royal Terns, Great Egrets, American Oystercatchers, and other water birds. We will cruise on the Henrietta Riverboat, docked in downtown Wilmington (at Dock Street), traveling to Battery Island across from Southport.

Lindsay Addison, a Coastal Biologist for Audubon NC, will narrate the cruise. In addition, Jill Peleuses of Wild Bird & Garden will be available onboard during our return

trip to answer any songbird-related questions you may have.

The Henrietta Riverboat features an air-conditioned lower level with tables and chairs and a canopy-covered upper deck with chairs. The riverboat is wheelchair accessible, restrooms are available, and the Henrietta crew provides a cash bar and snack bar. Boarding will begin at 10:30 a.m., departure will be at 11:00 a.m., and we will return at approximately 4-5 p.m. The ticket price includes a deluxe box lunch from Jason's Deli. Fun activities are planned during the return trip, including Bird Bingo! Additional details are provided with your ticket.

Tickets are limited this year...and sell out quickly, so buy yours as soon as possible! Tickets are \$100 each (check or cash) and include a deluxe box lunch from Jason's Deli.

The Battery Island Committee will have tickets for sale at the March General Meeting. Tickets will go on sale to the public at the Wild Bird & Garden Store located in Hanover Center on **March 15**. Buy your ticket right away, as tickets are limited and sell out quickly!

Eagle Island Cruise 10 - 11:30 am Tuesday, April 23, 2024

The Conservation Committee invites you to a narrated cruise along Eagle Island on April 23, 2024, from 10:00 to 11:30 a.m.

In 2022, the CFGC voted to support the development of Eagles Island Nature Park. Now is your opportunity to see and hear about the natural and cultural resources we want to preserve. Learn about rice plantations, Gullah Geechee history, shipbuilding, naval stores, and sunken ships. See the natural flora and fauna, perhaps even a bald eagle. Hear about the current status of different plans for the



island. Our narrators will be Captain Doug Springer of Wilmington Water Tours, Lloyd Singleton, NHC Extension Director and CFGC member, and Jim McKee, Site Manager of Brunswick Town/Fort Anderson. The cost is \$45, which includes a \$5 gratuity for the crew. We will be on the "Wilmington," a weather-protected non-rocking boat. The "Wilmington" is handicap accessible and has all ABC permits, snacks for sale, and an on-board restroom. A get-well card was sent to Debbie Reid, who fell and as a result, broke three toes and was terribly bruised.


